WineSafari: Wine, Landscape and Encounters – a Full-Day Adventure along the Alto Adige Wine Road

The Alto Adige Wine Road Association invites guests from April to October to join the WineSafari: a professionally guided journey of discovery through vineyards, cellars and wine villages – with tastings, lunch and shuttle service.

Kaltern/Caldaro, April 2026 – The Alto Adige Wine Road is one of Italy's oldest wine routes, uniting 16 picturesque wine-growing municipalities across some 4,400 hectares of vineyards, stretching from Nals/Nalles in the north to Salorno/Salurn in the south. Those who want not just to pass through this unique region but to truly experience it will find in the WineSafari the perfect format: a full-day, professionally accompanied experience that combines wine culture, landscape and culinary delights in an unforgettable way.

From the sparkling wine cellar to the wine bar – a day full of highlights

The WineSafari guides wine enthusiasts and the curious alike through the Alto Adige Wine Road. The programme is carefully crafted to showcase as many facets of the region as possible – from production to pleasure, from sparkling Sekt to aged red wine:

- A sparkling start: a guided tour of a sparkling wine cellar followed by a tasting – a wonderfully atmospheric way to begin the day.
- Right in the vineyard: an exclusive guided walk among the vines with an on-site tasting – wine culture you can reach out and touch.
- A culinary break: a relaxed 3-course lunch with matching wines, inviting guests to unwind and savour the moment.
- Into the depths of the cellar: a visit to a winery with a guided cellar tour and tasting – an insight into the art of wine ageing.
- A relaxed finale: a glass of wine or distillate accompanied by canapés.

Smooth logistics are ensured by a shuttle bus that picks participants up from their accommodation in the morning and brings them back in the evening.

For individuals and groups – from April to October

The WineSafari is offered annually from April to October and is available as a custom-bookable experience for groups from 10 people onwards – ideal for company outings, team-building events or special group occasions that combine a taste for quality with a spirit of adventure.



The Alto Adige Wine Road Association was founded in 2000, building on a promotional committee of seven municipalities established in 1964. It brings together around 75 member wineries and 9 tourism organisations along one of Italy's oldest wine routes – from Nals/Nalles in the north to Salorno/Salurn in the south, covering a total distance of 150 km. Around 75 % of South Tyrol's wine production takes place along this route.
