WineSounds on the Alto Adige Wine Road 2025 **An ensemble of music, wine and culture**

Between 18 October and 8 November 2025, the Alto Adige Wine Road once again became a stage for music, culture and pleasure: in its third edition, the WineSounds concert series hosted twelve extraordinary events in historic manor houses, castles and fortresses, bringing together outstanding wines and musical diversity.

Jazz, classical, folk or tango – the programme showcased a wide range of musical genres, creating unforgettable experiences paired with top regional wines and culinary specialities. The series opened with a Jazz Matinée by the Trio Chic featuring Helga Plankensteiner, followed by performances from the folk group Titlá, the Windkraft Ensemble, the Cinquino Brass Quintet, the David Frank Ensemble, the Tango X3 Quartet, Duo Aurora, the group Hortus Musice, the string trio Ladies in Dress, and the renowned pianists Bruna Pulini and Claire Huangci. The concert series concluded on 8 November with a performance by the woodwind quintet Lignum.

This year, too, the WineSounds captivated audiences with a special atmosphere at the venues: Haderburg Castle (Salorno/Salurn), Palais Baron von Longo (Neumarkt/Egna), Elena Walch Winery (Tramin/Termenon), Castel Sallegg and Windegg Estate (Kaltern am See/Caldaro al Lago), the Felsenkeller of Laimburg (Vadena/Pfatten), Freudenstein Castle (Eppan/Appiano), Waltherhaus and Kellerei Bozen Winery (Bolzano/Bozen), Von Braunbach Winery (Terlan/Terlano), Sternbauerhof (Andrian/Andriano) and Payersberg Castle (Nals/Nalles).

Under the artistic direction of Johann Finatzer, taking charge of the musical concept for the third time running, the event once again set new benchmarks for quality and variety. The concert series has thus further cemented its place as a fixture of the cultural autumn on the Alto Adige Wine Road.
